2023 PGA Jr. League

For the 2023 PGA Jr. season we were extremely fortunate to again have program founder and Michigan Golf Hall of Famer, Lynn Janson, back to lead the PGA Jr. League at The Legacy at Hastings. Coaches Janson and Hopkins provided exceptional instruction to the children and taught them valuable lessons for life and the game of golf.

Due to the immense support from our donors we were able to offer private lessons and a Youth on Course Membership (www.youthoncourse.org) to each of the children who participated in the program. In addition, the Barry County Jr. Golf Association reached an agreement with Coach Hopkins and Coach Janson to provide individual lessons to all our PGA Jr. Members at a reduced rate, paid for entirely by our Foundation. We were able to provide more than 100 lessons to the children. The value of those lessons were immense. We saw the results on the golf course and in the children's confidence levels.

Coach Janson and Coach Hopkins not only reduced their typical rate to make the lessons possible, but they also donated considerable time to the PGA Jr. Program as a whole. They were there for each practice and match throughout the season. Thankfully, they have both agreed to return for the Summer of 2024 to continue watching the children and program grow.

In addition to our coaches, our 2023 season would not have been possible without the support of our team sponsors, Cedar Creek Machinists Training, Kloosterman's Sports Tap, Tripp, Tagg & Storrs, Attorneys at Law and Hastings Fiberglass who sponsored the Hotsticks Team. This summer we implemented a number of changes to make the league more enjoyable for participants, parents, and coaches. Those changes were well received and included consistent practices every Tuesday and matches on Fridays and Sundays with the field divided in half to make golf carts more available and tee times less confusing. The final regular league standings were as follows:

It's best known for running the LPGA Tour, a series of weekly golf tournaments for elite women professional golfers from all around the world. The LPGA is one of the longest-running women's professional sports associations in the world.

Due to Coach Janson's connections and our amazing donors, we were able to take our PGA Jr. League members to watch the Meijer LPGA Classic on June 15, 2023! 142 of the best women golfers in the world were competing for \$2,500,000.00. The Meijer LPGA Classic was a big hit for our PGA Jr. League Members! Mason Slaughter and Hudson Tagg were asked by Maranda from *Where You Live*, "What's the best part of being out here on the golf course?" The boys replied, "Seeing these professional golfers golf."

Thanks to the hard work of our players and coaches, our PGA Jr. League qualified two All-Star teams to the PGA Jr. League National Championship Tournament. This year the regional tournament was held at Binder Park Golf Course in Battle Creek. As many of you may remember, our 2021 All Star team won the regional championship and ended up finishing as the fourth best PGA Jr. League team in the State of Michigan. Keigyn Johnson & Daylen Sybesma paced our 2023 All-Stars by shooting a one under round of 35. Unfortunately, it was not enough and our team did not qualify to move on to state finals. However, the kids had just as much fun participating and gained valuable experience for future events.

The PGA Jr. League is for players thirteen and under. Because of the age limit, four players, Dakota Cole, Charlie Mattice, Penn Phillips, and Pender Workman played their final year of PGA Jr. in 2023. We believe their futures are bright and hope that when you see them, you join with us in encouraging them to continue playing golf. Players must be at least ten years old to play in All-Star Matches and our PGA Jr. League has several nine-year old players who are working hard to fill those four spots and make next year's event.

The 2023 Lynn Janson Pro Am is our largest fundraiser of the year and this year's event was a smashing success. We were very fortunate, due largely to Mr. Janson's efforts and reputation, to draw 23 professionals to The Legacy at Hastings to participate in the fundraiser. We would also like to acknowledge Mr. Joshua Alderson, former General Manager at The Legacy at Hastings, for all the effort he put into the Pro Am.

Nearly 100 golfers played in the 2023 Lynn Janson Pro Am on September 1, 2023, at The Legacy at Hastings. The 2023 Champion was Mr. Jeff Bronkema who shot an <u>exceptional round of 65</u> to leave with the prize money. The team led by PGA Professional Zach Robbins, including one of our PGA Jr. League Alumni, Tyler Hausserman, took home the low gross prize with a 126. The team led by PGA Professional Jeff Bronkema, which included Amelia Hopiks (Coach Hopkins' wife), won the low net division with a 125. Many of the professionals who attended the event have already agreed to return next summer, on August 31, 2024 to support the Barry County Junior Golf Association.
